BACKGROUND

The 2022 Sustainable Public Procurement Global Review, published last month, aims to track global progress in sustainable procurement over the last five years. More expansive than the earlier editions from 2013 and 2017, the report is organized according to two Parts. Part I provides important insight into the current state of sustainable procurement (SP), as well as progress in the development of sustainable public procurement policies, implementation activities and monitoring efforts among national governments. It also offers recommendations for policy and decision-makers seeking to engage and/or step up their efforts in this area. Part II explores the diffusion of SP to the private sector, international organizations and the role of supporting entities. Findings are based on a cross-cutting analysis of data collected in 2021 on the SP activities of 314 organizations and 45 national governments, as well as insights from interviews with sustainable procurement experts. The research is complemented by the supplement "Factsheets on Sustainable Public Procurement in National Governments", which includes 45 country factsheets detailing the SPP policy frameworks, priorities and implementation activities in place in each country.

OBJECTIVE

To present the current global landscape of sustainable procurement, based on the main findings and conclusions of Part I and II of the 2022 Sustainable Public Procurement Global Review.
